Inmate Solomon is a well-established violent felon and should not be paroled. The circumstances surrounding his current conviction and his prior criminal record show that he poses an unreasonable risk of violence to the community. Inmate Solomon narrowly avoided a 3-Strikes sentence that would have led to a 25-Life sentence.

During the first three weeks of November 2015, Inmate Solomon broke into an apartment and used the apartment as his living quarters. The tenant was in the process of moving in and was in and out of the city during the time. After using the apartment how he saw fit, Inmate Solomon added insult to injury when he called a friend to aid him under the guise of "moving out of his apartment." The friend showed up and Inmate Solomon loaded pieces of furniture and a TV into the friend's truck and stole them. Inmate Solomon was confirmed as the perpetrator because his DNA was discovered on a bottle that was consumed inside the apartment.

The Inmate's record is also atrocious. The Inmate has been convicted of 18 crimes in his past. There have been five felonies, 13 misdemeanors, three strike offenses, four drug related offenses, and ten theft related offenses. The Inmate has demonstrated his inability to assimilate into society. The only hope is to protect society for as long as possible.

As we are given 30 days to respond, and we are not provided with any disciplinary history or any other information aside from the one page notice of parole review, I cannot comment on Inmate Solomon's prison conduct. However, from the record that is available it is clear that inmate Solomon should not be released as he poses a significant, unreasonable risk of violence to the community. Parole should be denied.
